Leading this discussion will be two of the world's foremost experts on the social implications of autonomous vehicles, Dr. Jack Stilgoe and Dr. Jameson Wetmore. Following an introduction to some of the key ethical issues associated with the development, deployment, and regulation of autonomous vehicles, there will be an open discussion period in which all of our guests and participants can pose questions and voice their concerns.

Dr. Jack Stilgoe is a Senior Lecturer in the Department of Science & Technology Studies at University College London. He is Principal Investigator of the Driverless Futures? Project, a three year social science project looking at the governance of self-driving cars. His most recent book is *Who's Driving Innovation? New Technologies and the Collaborative State* (Palgrave, 2020)



Dr. Jameson Wetmore is an Associate Professor in the School for the Future of Innovation in Society and co-director of the Center for Engagement and Training in Science and Society at Arizona State University. His work combines the fields of science and technology studies, ethics, and public policy in order to better understand both the interconnected relationships between technology and society
